He has served congregations in Minnesota, California, and North Carolina, and is currently Organist and Director of Worship, Music, and Arts at St. John's Lutheran Church in Northfield, MN.

In addition to overseeing a large and vibrant music program, each week he leads two worship services at the organ and directs choirs of youth and adults.

He has been in residence at Montreat Conference Center for several summers planning and leading music for the Montreat Youth Conference, and this summer will co-direct two weeks of the conference. Nathan has written articles for Call to Worship and Presbyterians Today, and he enjoys trips for mission work, for fun, and for coffee.

David Sims grew up in Champaign, IL, but soon headed north to attend St. Olaf College in Northfield, MN, where he earned a B.M. in Church Music/Organ with Catherine Rodland and John Ferguson.

While at St. Olaf he toured nationally and internationally with the St. Olaf Choir and held several leadership positions with the group.

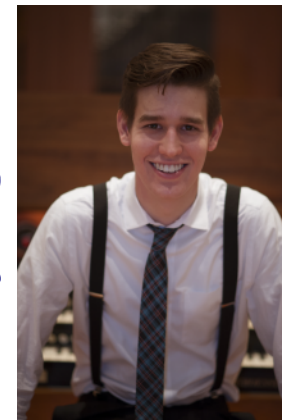
David earned a Masters of Music in Organ Performance from Indiana University in 2008, studying with Dr. Larry Smith, and stayed in Indiana for 6 more years to serve as Director of Music at North Christian Church in Columbus.

During his time in Indiana he also worked full time for Goulding & Wood Pipe Organ Builders, specializing in wiring, tuning, and service work.

David serves as Cantor at Holy Trinity Lutheran Church in Minneapolis, MN, where he plays organ, directs two adult choirs, and assists in worship planning and preparation.

His compositions are published by GIA and Augsburg Fortress.

Greg Zelek



Greg Zelek is increasingly recognized as one of the most exciting young organists in the American organ scene.

A native of Miami, Florida, Greg is a graduate student of Paul Jacobs at the Juilliard School, where he received his Bachelor of Music degree. Also at Juilliard, Greg is a proud recipient of a Kovner Fellowship, having been one of nineteen selected for the inaugural fellowship that covers full cost of attendance. He was the First Prize winner in both the 2012 Rodgers North American Classical Organ Competition and the 2012 West Chester University Organ Competition, and was selected as a 2010 NFAA YoungArts Silver Medal Winner. He won First Prize, as well as the "Bach Prize," at the East Carolina University Organ Competition, and was a prizewinner in the Albert Schweitzer Organ Festival.

Greg is the Music Director and Organist at the Episcopal Church of St. Matthew and St. Timothy in New York City. Prior to this appointment, he served as Organ Scholar at Hitchcock Presbyterian Church in Scarsdale, New York. Greg, who is a Cuban-American and a native Spanish speaker, was the Music Director of Corpus Christi Catholic Church in Miami, and has served as the summer organist for San Pedro Apostol Church in Ramales de la Victoria, Spain.
