WOCO FEST 2022: AMAZE

At this year's WoCo Fest, we presented a total of **43** artists and **8** composers, with **46** works by women composers performed.



ELIZABETH HENRIKSEN MENTORSHIP PROGRAM

Through the Elizabeth Henriksen Mentorship Program, Boulanger Initiative was able to serve three early-stage professional composers and twelve young student composers by providing guidance, support, opportunity, and community. All of these composers are gender marginalized, and participated in this program at no cost to them. Early-stage professional composers received one-on-one mentoring, professional development workshops, and masterclasses with our world-renowned women composer mentors.



Redefining the Canon (RtC) is an unprecedented initiative which aims to update the most widely-used orchestral audition excerpts to include excerpts by historically underrepresented composers. Throughout RtC's soft launch, we have developed partnerships with the Dallas Symphony Orchestra, National Philharmonic, African Diaspora Music Project, and League of American Orchestras.

Our composition workshops and recordings of works composed by women gained new viewers across the globe throughout YouTube and Facebook.

COUNTRIES AROUND THE WORLD



Our recently introduced Women Composers Alphabet Posters have made their way to classrooms and households in 11 countries across the world and 39 states in the US.

The companion booklet for these posters is also hot off the press, allowing for students and women composer fans to learn more about the lives and accomplishments of the composers on our posters.

WOMEN AND GENDER MARGINALIZED COMPOSERS REPERTOIRE DATABASE

Our database has grown significantly throughout the past six months, with **630** new works being added and **1,465** total composers. We are currently developing a searchable prototype, and hope to have a public version released by the

Composer of the Month

Margaret Bonds

Margaret Allison Bonds (March 3, 1913 – April 26, 1972) was an American composer, pianist, arranger, and teacher. Bonds was the first African American soloist to appear with the Chicago Symphony and played an important role in the development of twentieth century classical and musical theater. She was the recipient of the Rosenwald Fellowship and a Rodman Wanamaker award for composition. One of the first Black composers and performers to gain recognition in the United States, she is best remembered today for her popular arrangements of African–American spirituals, musical adaptations of Shakespeare, and frequent collaborations with Langston Hughes.


Get Involved!
