	Question	Answer
1	For the Associate exam in 2024, we only do part a. Correct?	<p>Yes. Part a in the fugue question. The Associate 2024 requirements do not include anything about modulation or an episode.</p> <p>For several decades, this question has always included two parts: a) the actual exposition including all entries of the subject and b) an episode that involved additional contrapuntal techniques. This webinar used last year's question, which featured a part b. There will be no part b on the exam this June. The candidate will only be required to write an exposition. Still, the committee recommends this webinar since the principles of good contrapuntal writing will be expected regardless. This webinar will touch upon many areas of successful writing in a fugal exposition.</p>
